## **Coaches Remit**

### **Practice Sessions**

- 1) Coaches are first and foremost responsible for the overall safety, development and enjoyment of the players in their squad whilst involved in a training session.
- 2) Coaches should arrive in advance of the session starting to ensure the coaching area is safe for the activities that are about to take place.
- 3) Coaches should make sure that sessions start on time and that players are punctual, to allow a quality session to take place. If players are struggling to arrive on time they should inform coaches as early as possible.
- 4) Coaches are responsible for overseeing the safe and appropriate use of equipment and for ensuring that equipment is stored away neatly and safely, both during and after the session.
- 5) Coaches are responsible for making sure the athletes are appropriately prepared for each session and physically prepared for the activity within it.
- 6) Coaches should design differentiated coaching sessions that challenge players of different abilities to develop and grow in confidence through each session.
- 7) Coaches should endeavour to have an appropriate balance of skill development and tactical understanding throughout their coaching sessions.
- 8) Coaches are responsible for communicating with team managers and with committee regarding any information for, or from their coaching sessions which may be needed by the players/parents/club.
- 9) Coaches are responsible for making sure sessions run on time and finish on time to allow other squads/clubs access to the appropriate area when needed. Coaches should also ensure that sessions are finished promptly at the end of the evening to allow facilities manager's time to lock up.
- 10) Coaches will be made aware of CPD opportunities that they can embark upon, but should also look to develop their own coaching knowledge and skills

where possible. Support will be provided on a regular basis by the club head coach to assist with this.

- 11) Coaches should be appropriately dressed for the activity and lead by example in behaviour, language and appearance at training sessions.
- 12) Coaches should ensure that all relevant funds are collected and recorded at the end of each session and passed onto head coach/club treasurer as soon as possible.

## **Games**

- 1) Coaches are responsible for making sure players arrive at games well in advance of tip off to allow suitable set-up/warm-up time before each game.
- 2) Coaches are responsible for ensuring players are appropriately dressed for the activity and adhere to club/association rules regarding clothing, jewellery etc.
- 3) Coaches are responsible for making sure balls, strips, shooting tops and water bottles are available for games, and that strips adhere to national association guidelines.
- 4) Coaches are responsible for player's behaviour towards officials, team mates and opposition players and are required to take appropriate action should a player not adhere to their code of conduct.
- 5) Coaches need to ensure that players are given appropriate opportunity to participate in games wherever possible, but should also ensure that each player appreciates their role within the squad on game days.
- 6) Coaches should set an example to players with their conduct towards game officials, opposing coaches/players and their own squad.
- 7) Coaches are responsible for making sure that players tidy up after the game and help safely store club equipment in appropriate manner.
- 8) Coaches should ensure that all relevant funds are collected and recorded at the end of each game and passed onto head coach/club treasurer as soon as possible.
- 9) Coaches will liaise with team managers to ensure that all relevant information, including transportation details, is passed onto the players.
